

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918 the 'War to end all Wars' ended.

100 years on throughout the country there were opportunities to remember those who took part in the conflict and to honour the memory of those who gave their lives for their country.



In 1914, Cuckfield was a small village of approximately 2,000 souls of which 20% signed up for military service during the war years.

81 Cuckfield men gave their lives in the conflict. Photographs of 37 of the 81 will be displayed outside their 35 homes.

Estate Agent Marcus Grimes' window displayed photographs of 72 of the 81 men and the White Hart, Cuckfield Bathrooms, Cuckfield iWear and the Rose and Crown will display photographs of the Post Office Rifles who were billeted in the village for 6 months in 1914-15. Photographs at the Queen's Hall shown when it was used as a Voluntary Aid Detachment (VAO) Hospital.
